Stroll around The Island, a small peninsula where you can see the Jamieson and Goulburn Rivers meet. Pack a picnic to enjoy in the shade of the trees.

THE ARBORETUM
Enjoy the views from the Arboretum over the surrounding mountain ranges. A great place to take in the sunset with your loved ones.

BEAUTIFUL TREES
Jamieson is well loved for its beautiful deciduous trees that change throughout the seasons. Springtime brings fresh green leaves and in autumn the town is coloured in all shades of yellow, orange and red.

ST. JOHN CATHOLIC CHURCH
This pretty redbrick church was built in 1899 and holds Sunday Mass at 11AM.

OLD STAR OF THE WEST GOLDMINE

Jamieson's gold rush days are long gone but you can still visit the once richest local mine. Much of the gold in this area was found here in the 1800's. From the road you can reach the gold mine by four-wheel drive or on foot. Find more information and directions in the leaflet that is available at Jamieson Caravan Park.

MT TERRIBLE HUT

The fun four-wheel drive track and amazing views from the top make an outing to Mt Terrible one of Jamieson's most well loved day trips. On the summit you can find Mt Terrible hut and a fire tower.

OLD KEVINGTON SETTLEMENT

The original Kevington township was built along Macks Creek. Take the 4WD track to see the remains of this Gold Rush town.

HISTORIC CEMETERY

Walk to the historic cemetery, the resting place of Jamieson's early settlers. Find the self guided walk leaflet at Jamieson Caravan Park, the General Store and the Post Office.

TUNNEL BEND

Another relic of the gold rush is tunnel bend, a tunnel that was constructed to divert the Goulburn River. When the river is low you can even walk the entire length of the 80 metre long tunnel!

BOAT RAMP

Launch your boat into Lake Eildon from here. This is the closest boat ramp to Jamieson. If the water level of Lake Eildon is too low you can find the next boat ramp in Goughs Bay.

OLD SWEAT GOLD DIGGINGS

Find these old gold diggings on the east side of the road. You can read more information about this spot at Scots Mist Day Reserve across the road.

MANSFIELD-WOODS POINT RD

Jamieson to Mansfield.
Visit Mansfield for supermarkets, boutiques, cafe's and restaurants. The road to Mansfield is sealed.

Jamieson to Woods Point.
The road to Woods Point is only partly sealed. You can find many rest areas along this road where you can have a picnic and a swim in the Goulburn River.

EILDON-JAMIESON RD

Drive the beautiful but very winding road to Eildon where you can see the Eildon Dam Wall and have a picnic along the Goulburn river. From Eildon you can either drive back the same way or drive around the lake via Alexandra, Yarck and Mansfield. All these roads are sealed.

JAMIESON-LICOLA RD

The Jamieson - Licola Rd is an unsealed road that is better suited for four-wheel drive vehicles. The scenery along this road is spectacular and takes you over Mt Skene and through beautiful forests. Beware of seasonal closures.

MOUNT TERRIBLE WINES

Built during the gold rush of the 1860s, the now closed Kevington Hotel is a historic landmark of this area.
